Female 60 years. CETOLONI Maria, 109, Santa Firmina,

Who saith.

I am the widow of CHTOLONI Giovenni Battista, a farm labourer aged 63 years. We had been married for fifteen years and both of us had lived in CIVITELLA for the past thirtyfive years.

I left CIVITHILA on 19 June, 1944 to pay a visit to my daughter at this address. When I left the town my husband was alive and well.

On Thursday, 29 June, 1944 I was working on a hill near here from which I could see OIVITELLA which is about twenty kilometres away. I saw smoke rising from the town.

In consequence of this I returned to CIVITELLA the same afternoon and found the dead body of my husband laying in the road near the south gate of the town. He had a bullet wound in the neck.

On Friday 30 June, 1944, I carried the body of my husband to the CHURCH of S.M. ASSUNTA. He was buried in the cometery at CIVITELIA on Saturday, 1 July, 1944.

Ny husband was not a Partisan and had never rendered them any assistance.

This statement has been read over to me. correct and true. I herewith append my mark.
