STATEMENT OF:-

MARCHETTI Isolina,	Female
Le Caselle,	30 years.
Civitella.	

Who saith,

I am a married woman and have lived here for the past eight years. I am the sister-in-law of MARCHETTI Gino who was killed on 29 June, 44. He was 36 years of age a farm worker, and had lived at this address for the past twenty years.

About 0630 hours on Thursday 29 June, 44, my brother-in-law left home with the expressed intention of attending Mass at the Church of S. MARIA ASSUNTA, CIVITELLA. He was then in perfect health.

About 0800 hours the same day I was returning from church at OLIVETO when I saw CIVITELLA burning and heard the sounds of machine gun and rifle fire from the town. No Germans came near my house.

About 1500 hours the same day I went to CIVITELLA to look for my brother-in-law. I eventually found his dead body laying in the room of a house in the town.

He had what appeared to be a bullet wound in the centre of his forehead.

I could not do anything that day except to prepare his body for burial.

He was buried in the cemetery at OLIVETO on Saturday 1 July 44.

My brother-in-law was not a Partisan.

I have read over this statement. It is true and correct. I herewith append my signature.
