STATEMENT OF !-

PANZIFRI Teresa, No.27 San Pancrazio. Female.
Aged 43 years.

Who saith,

Up to the 29th. June 1944, I was living with my husband PANZIERI Antonio, aged 40 years. During the morning of this day I saw lots of German soldiers in the village and advised my husband to stay indoors. About 0800 hours I saw two soldiers at the foot of the garden who were wearing black shirts and civilian trousers, and I thought they were Fascists. Somewhere about 0900 hours, three German soldiers came to my house and I cooked them some eggs. They stayed about an hour and before leaving, ordered me to stay in the house.

About 1300 hours more German soldiers came and told us to evacuate. Upon seeing my husband, they arrested him and I saw him being led towards the square. That was the last time I saw him. At the top end of the village, I saw a lot of other women who had been driven from their homes and I stayed with them until about 1900 hours. I then returned to the village where I saw my house on fire, so I left again and went to live with my parents near PONTECINO.

Upon returning to SAN PANCHAZIO, a few days later, I was informed that a number of charred bodies had been found at the FATTORIA FIERANCHII but I do not know if my husband was one of them. I have not seen him since the 29th. June 1944, when he was taken away by the Germans.

I could not describe any particular soldier. They all, excepting the two who were black shirts, were dressed in the usual German uniform.

I have read over this statement. It is true and correct. I herewith append my signature.
