STATEMENT OF:-

NANNINI Adalgisa,
nee CINELLI.

Who saith,

I am a married woman living with my husband and am the daughter of CINELLI Ulderigo, aged 58 years, (now deceased).

On the morning of the 29th. June, 1944, my father opened the door of the house about 0600 hours. Just as he did this, two German soldiers caught hold of him, and I saw them take him to the village square. During the morning I saw German soldiers arresting men of the village and escorting them to the square. After my father had been arrested, more soldiers came to our house and at the revolver point demanded meat and eggs.

About 1300 hours I was compelled to evacuate, and along with the other women I went to the top end of the village. Whilst passing by the square I saw my father and a lot of other men being guarded by some German soldiers. I have not seen him alive since. Towards evening I came back to our house and found it on fire. Seeing this I left the village and I went to stay with other women in the surrounding woods.

A number of days later we all returned to live in the village, and when the dead bodies were removed from the FATTORIA PIERANGELI cellar, I was present, but was unable to identify the body, or any particle of clothing belonging to my father. I did recognise part of the village priest's hat which was amongst the wreckage.

I could not recognise or give any description of the German soldiers I saw that day, because I was so afraid.

I have read over the above statement and it is true and correct.
