FURTHER STATEMENT OF :-

CARLETTI Licia,

Who saith,

I would like to add that whilst I was a prisoner in the Villa CARLETTI and during the time that I was taken from MONTE S. SAVINO to FLORENCE I got on very friendly terms with the German soldiers who were guarding us.

Four of the German soldiers and one Italian wrote their names and addresses on a piece of paper for the purpose of writing to me after the war. Another German wrote his on a second piece of paper and one other wrote his name and address in a book. This address I believe to be a military one.

These pieces of paper, now marked EXHIBIT "A" and EXHIBIT "A1" also the book, marked "EXHIBIT A2", I have handed to Sgt. CLEGG of the British Special Investigation Branch this day 5 April 45.

I describe the six men as follows:-

1. Hermann LINDEMANN, from MÜNSTER in WESTF., WEVELINKHOFFERGASSE 10-13. About 30 years, 1m. 60 cm. tall (approx.) blue eyes, defective in his speech. He was dressed in light khaki shirt with a Red Cross badge on one sleeve.

He wrote his name on the paper twice, providing two addresses; one in Germany, one in Holland.

2. ZUKNER Paul, from MINGOLSHHEIM BEN BRUCHSAL, FRIEDRICHSTR. 65. About 23 years, 1m. 85cm. tall (approx.) medium build, brown complexion, dark hair, grey eyes. He was dressed in blue-grey uniform, boots and gaiters. The collar of his jacket was edged with silver piping and there were two or three silver bars on either side, like this :-

He had a grey band around each cuff with the words "HERMANN GOERING" inscribed thereon in white letters.

3. ROHL Erwin, "INSEGNANTE FLAUTO", from BERLIN, No. 55, PASTEURSTR. 44-46 V.1. whom I gave a full description of in my previous statement.

4. ROLF MATTHIES, from CHEMNITZ, HANS-LOUIS STR. 13 b/STIEGEL. He also wrote his military address in a book of "FAUST", and it is :- R. MATTHIES Offz., L 42700- L4-P MÜNCHEN II. About 22 years, 1m. 70cm. tall (approx.) good build, brown complexion, dark hair, grey eyes. He wore grey-blue uniform the collar of which was similar to that of ZUKNER. He also had the

words "HERMANN GOERING"/....

/also had the

words " HERMANN GOERING" inscribed on his cuffs.

5. MAX MILDE, from NIEDER-HERMSDORF 16. Kr. NEISSE (OBERSCH-  
LESNIEN). About 20 years, about 1m.75cms. tall, well built,  
pale complexion, fair hair, blue eyes. He wore blue-grey  
uniform with " HERMANN GOERING" inscribed on his sleeves.

6. RAGNO Licio, an Italian from 23, Via G. FARBUCCI, PADUA.  
About 23 years, 1m.75cms. tall, well built, dark complexion,  
dark hair, very round face. He was always dressed in civilian  
clothes. On one occasion when I was talking to one of the  
soldiers, I cannot remember whom, he told me that RAGNO used  
to go into the British lines for information; he also said  
that RAGNO had been imprisoned by the British somewhere near  
CASERTA.

I have read over this statement. I read and  
understand English. It is true and correct. I herewith  
append my signature.
