STATEMENT OF :-

PACI Venicio,	Male
54, Corso San Gallo,	34 years.
Monte San Savino.	

Who saith,

I am a landowner and have lived here all my life. In December 43, owing to air raids I evacuated with my family to my estate at SAN ROVERINO, where we stayed until the arrival of the Allies, that is towards mid-July, 44.

On 10 July 44, one of my farmers informed me of a bad smell coming from the region of the fountain in the estate. In consequence of this I went to see and found the body of a man, which I recognised as that of CARLOTTI Luigi, from MONTE SAN SAVINO, lying at the edge of the wood about eighty metres away from the fountain. His face was disfigured, but I was able to identify him by my long acquaintance with him. Owing to the decomposed state of his body I could not establish how he died.

I had the body removed to the hospital of MONTE SAN SAVINO and the following day 11 July, it was buried in the local cemetery.

I have read over this statement. It is correct and true. I herewith append my signature.
