CHELI Pio, Monte San Savino, Aresgo. Male 70 years.

Who saith,

I am a labourer and have lived here all my life.

On 5 July 44, the day after the Germans left this area, I visited the VILLA CARLETTI in MONTE SAN SAVISC. My reason for going was, I knew that the Germans had held several people prisoner there for a number of days. My intention was to render assistance to any civilian who I thought maybe still locked in some part of the building. I searched the house but found no one.

In the dining room of the villa I found a German soldier's shirt. In the pocket of the shirt I found a German soldier's "SULIMUCH" book, three photograph prints and a negative. The book, now marked "EXHIBIT A J" and the photographs "RXHIBITS A 14, A 5 and A 6, respectively, I have today, 28 May 145, handed to Sgt. CLEMION of the British Special Investigation Brook.

German soldiers other than those who held the CARLETTI family as prisoners occupied this villa.

The soldiers book and photographs I produce.

The shirt mentioned above I have since thrown away.

This statement has been read over to me. It is correct and true. I herewith append by mark.
