STATEMENT OF:-

Who saith,

I am single and have lived at my present address all my life.

On the 30th. June, 1944, at about 1900 hours a party of German soldiers arrived here on about ten trucks. One of the soldiers told me he was a captain and asked me for a bedroom. This officer then asked me whether there were any partisans here or in the neighbourhood and I told him there were not. He then stated that if he discovered any partisans he would have done the same here as he did at CIVITELLA and at SAN PANCRAZIO.

This officer spoke Italian fairly well. A few minutes later my brother GIUSEPPE arrived and he confirmed the conversation with the officer.

Later that day, I saw the German soldiers put ten geese, three pigs and three calves into one of our stables.

The Germans stayed that evening and the following day; they departed about 1900 hours on the 1st. July, 1944. They left behind the body of a private car. This body is still in our farmyard and is of a cream colour. At the rear it bears a sign consisting of a blue "N" on a white circle; at the right of this sign there is a figure "6" painted white.

The officer who conversed with me, I describe as follows:-

About 50 years of age, about 5ft. 9ins. - 10ins., well built, bald, fresh complexion, full face. He made himself understood in Italian. I do not know anything more concerning the German soldiers who were here.

I have read over this statement. It is true and correct. I herewith append my signature.
