Who saith,

For the past 11 years I have practiced as a professional photographer and I have been authorized to practice my profession by the Command of the Allied Armies in Italy.

On Tuesday 20th. March, 1945, I accompanied Sgt. CLEWLOW of the British Special Police to the VILLA MANCINI at LE FABBRICHE. There I was shown a door on which were the imprints of five names which I photographed.

We then proceeded to a farm at PIEVE A PRESOLANO where I was shown the body of an Italian FIAT motor car, which I also photographed. I printed these photographs and on Tuesday 27th. March, 1945, I handed over the negatives and prints to Sgt. CLEWLOW.

I have read over this statement. It is correct and true. I herewith append my signature.
